Waiting

Waiting seems to be getting more difficult all the time. As we get older, not only are there more times in which we have to wait (especially for doctors and other appointments), but the waiting seems to be getting longer. It seems that there was a time when we did not have to wait as long, or for as many reasons.

Our culture has for a long time pursued ways to eliminate or at reduce the wait. Fast food took care of restaurant waits. Drive-thrus at the bank helped out with bank waits.

Simultaneously, we have found ways to keep busy while we wait. Look at any line or waiting room, and you will see people staring down at a phone. Twenty-five years ago, people would at least have to bring a book or a magazine, or they could watch television in many waiting rooms.

All of this indicates that we are not good at waiting. We do not like to wait. And yet, God makes us wait. He does not always answer our prayers immediately. He lets us live within our sufferings. And He tells us that He will return. Just wait. All who are alive have been waiting their entire lives for Jesus to return. Many waited their whole lives and still did not see Jesus return. At a certain point, it begins to feel like it will not happen; or at least, if it does, it will be far past our own lifetime so it does not matter for us. We just have to make do with the wait.

Imagine the surprise of so many when He does return. They will be caught off-guard. Many, tired of waiting, will have turned to other things

What about you? How long will you wait? Will you wait for Jesus to return? And what will you do while you wait?

Jesus tells you to watch for His return (Luke 21:34). Paul tells you to pray without ceasing (1 Thessalonians 5:17) and rejoice continually (Philippians 4:4). Think about heavenly, excellent things (Philippians 4:8). Sounds like while you are waiting, church is a great place to be!
