The Epiphany

The term "epiphany" refers to a revelation or a divine visitation. In common English usage, it reflects a sudden insight, but through the history of the church, it has been reserved to indicate the day when first the Divine glory was revealed to the Magi who had come from the east.

The Feast of the Epiphany is always on January 6, twelve days after the celebration of Christmas. Since the fourth century, this is the day on which the church has chosen to celebrate the historic visit of gentiles from outside of Israel, come to visit the newborn king. It was on that day that Jesus was presented with the gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

Matthew records in chapter 2 the visit of the Magi. The number of visitors is not specified; only that they brought the 3 gifts. It also indicates that they found Jesus with Mary, in a house. This, with certain archaeological evidence, suggests a different picture than you may have been imagining.

Recent discoveries suggest that there was not an "inn" as we think of it. More likely, Luke referred to a guest room on the upper floor of the house of a relative of Mary. The same Greek word would be used for the "upper room" where Jesus later celebrated Passover with His disciples (though in Jerusalem rather than Bethlehem). A different word is used for the place to which the Good Samaritan took the victim he rescued from the road.

The pieces all point to Mary and Joseph staying on the lower level of a house, where the kitchen would be, along with space to bring in animals from the cold, while the family and their guests would typically sleep upstairs. Thus, Jesus was perhaps born in a house, where animals might be kept, so there was a stone food trough (manger) there that would serve as his bassinet. This is where the star led the shepherds that night.

And twelve days later, according to custom, the star led the Magi, who brought Him gifts. In some cultures, presents are given in celebration of Epiphany rather than Christmas! This marks the end of the season and celebration of Christmas!
