# The Beginning of Jesus' Ministry

Based on historical clues in the Gospel accounts, Jesus was likely around thirty years old when He began His ministry. Not very much is known about His childhood and early life. The Gospels record His birth, the visit by the magi, the flight to Egypt to escape Herod's plan to kill all Hebrew boys 2 years old and under, and the return to Nazareth.

Luke shares that when Jesus was twelve, He accompanied Mary and Joseph and other relatives on a pilgrimage to Jerusalem, to the Temple, for Passover. When the rest of the family left, Jesus did not. It took a three days for them to realize He was not with them, return and look for Him. Perhaps the three days was a foreshadowing of the three days He would spend between His crucifixion and resurrection!

When they did find Him, He was in the temple; He asked them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" He had been sitting with the teachers in the Temple. Luke says that "Jesus increased in wisdom and in stature and in favor with God and man." This has caused many to wonder. Since He was already God, did He not already know everything? And why would He have to "increase . . . in favor with God . . .?"

Jesus was both God and man: God from eternity, but man only since He was conceived in Mary's womb. And He had to grow from a single cell just as did every one of us. The only difference is that His spirit was not stained with the corruption of original sin, like ours. Just as His body had to grow, it makes sense that His mind did, as well. And though He was God, Paul would later write that "He did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped" (Philippians 2:6).

When Jesus told His parents that He had to be "in His Father's house," He was already pointing to the crucifixion, that in Jerusalem, He would accomplish the salvation of the world. Luke also records that He was submissive to them, an obedient child to them as well as to the Father.

Luke also records that even from the beginning, people would not understand what He said to them. Already at twelve, Luke records, Mary and Joseph "did not understand the saying that he spoke to them. Once He rose from the dead, and especially now, it is much easier to piece everything together and see the blessings Jesus came to bring.
